EAST MANATEE

undreds of Braden River Middle School students looked up surprised before school Wednesday as trumpets sounded above them.

Eight members from the school's eighth-grade band were on the second floor, above the courtyard, trumpeting the arrival of — well — what?

Suddenly, a knight on a horse clippety-clopped right into the courtyard as the students stood stunned.

When the medieval-garbed knight was within earshot he said, in an evilsounding voice, "I am Mogart."
Within seconds, hundreds of chil-

Book, One School," said Paula Gray, Braden River Middle media specialist.
